Work Experience Requirements and Benefits for Full-Time Students at South Bank Colleges

SOUTH BANK

As a full-time student at South Bank Colleges, you'll be required to complete a work experience placement as part of your course. This placement will last a minimum of five days and will be scheduled around your study timetable. We strongly encourage students to fully engage with local employers and the professional community, allowing you to start building your own professional networks and acquire the skills that employers value. Regardless of the career path you choose, while there's a wealth of careers information available, nothing compares to the insight, knowledge, and inspiration gained from meeting employers and working alongside professionals in the field.

Your safety is our top priority. Every placement is thoroughly risk assessed, and we partner with employers who are inclusive and committed to equality and diversity. These employers will ensure you are given tasks that contribute to your skills development.

Why is work experience placements important?

- You'll have the chance to gain invaluable experience, connecting your classroom learning with real industry insights while developing both technical and practical skills in your chosen career fields and specialisations.
- Your placement will be in a setting relevant to your course and aligned with your career goals. You'll discover what life in your chosen career is truly like and may even receive guidance from a Mentor or Coach.
- This experience will help you make informed decisions about your career options and equip you with the transferable skills that future employers seek.
- Some students are even offered jobs or apprenticeships directly as a result of their industry work experience placement.

How Placements Work



Placement Patterns

You'll be expected to find and secure your own work placement as soon as you enroll at the College. Many students find that the process of searching for a placement is a valuable learning experience, helping to build confidence and self-advocacy skills.

If you encounter challenges in finding a placement, our Placement Officers are available to assist you. If you already have a part-time job that aligns with your chosen career field (e.g., studying Health & Social Care and working in the care sector), it may count as your work experience. Just make sure to inform a Placement Officer, so your job can be recorded. Please complete the form below and submit it to your Placement Officer.

Your work placement must total at least 36 hours (5 days), which can be spread out over the duration of your course. It can also extend beyond five days if necessary.

Most work experience placements are unpaid, but in some cases, your employer may choose to pay you or cover some of your travel expenses. However, this should not be expected—focus instead on how the experience will benefit your future career.

Some employers may require a DBS check before starting a placement, and we can support you with this process.

Our Standards

Work experience placements are designed to give you the best possible foundation for your future career. Your course tutors and placement officers will provide extensive support to help you prepare and reach your full potential through:

- Work-related projects and activities
- Interview and employability skills workshops
- Industry-based talks and visits
- Upskilling masterclasses and taster sessions

Placements can be conducted either in-person at a workplace or remotely. We ensure that all placements take place in safe environments that comply with our safeguarding policies; for example, placements cannot be in locations that sell alcohol, tobacco, or other items restricted to underage individuals.
